Description of the Aging & Health Studies Program:

The purpose of the Aging & Health Studies Program at Hostos Community College is to prepare students for careers that involve working with older adults. Qualified professionals can work in such settings as: senior citizen centers, health related and skilled nursing facilities, and home health care agencies.

The Aging & Health Studies Program awards the Associate in Applied Science (A.A.S.) degree. Students who would like to further their education may then apply their courses at a four-year institution in a program of gerontology, social work, physical or recreation therapy, etc.

The Aging & Health Studies Program is interdisciplinary in nature and will draw upon faculty expertise from different departments within the College.

Skills:

Emotional Skills: An effective employee needs to be caring, understanding, non-judgmental, and have a strong ability to empathize with patients from all walks of life.

Communication Skills: Language and listening skills are extremely important. You will have to be able to communicate with doctors, patients, and your coworkers.

Observational Skills: An employee needs to be able to identify anything out of the ordinary. This includes wounds, strange behavior, or anything that just doesn't seem right.

Physical Skills: Gerontology will require a substantial amount of physical activity. You will be lifting, moving, adjusting, and sometimes restraining.

Employment Opportunities:

Recreation Aides and Social and Human Service Assistants opportunities are available in Nursing Homes, Private Senior or Community Services Agencies, Medical and Health Services and hospitals.

Employment Outlook:

Employment of social and human service assistants is projected to grow 11 percent from 2014 to 2024, faster than the average for all occupations.
