(the two lower grades classified at general bio electives on transcript)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students enroll in programs because the per credit hour rate is cheaper even though they have no intention of getting a degree at Hostos. Degree-seeking students, who should be classified as non-matriculated students negatively impact our retention stats as they have no intention of graduating.
