



Experience With SGA:

I, Denise Herrera was the chair for the scholarship committee the student government association scholarship is financial aid for students who are either in need of financial aid or have achieved academic success. \$10,000 are allocated for the scholarship which means the chair and the rest of the team get to decide how the money will be divided. One of the most important things is to work as a team with the scholarship committee. The main problems we faced during the scholarship process was how do we know who is undocumented or not? Unfortunately, in the Fall 2017 semester we



had many students who applied and were undocumented. The system is unable to tell us who is undocumented or not. It was 10 merit and 10 need-based scholarships that were awarded. In Spring 2018 it was just 20 merits based.

Recommendations:

When the scholarship coordinator opens the scholarship make sure to indicate to students the law that states who are eligible for the scholarship. In addition, it's important to work as a team and make sure to promote the opening of the scholarship. One of the biggest One Vision accomplishments was the participation rate. Opening a scholarship that is merit based and need based is difficult because you need to distinguish whether the applicant is applying for merit or need. I also recommend opening the scholarship in the beginning of the semester since students tend to delay their submissions until the deadline. Another goal that was not achieved was a scholarship ceremony due to misunderstandings based on legal status. But a ceremony is highly encouraged I also suggest keeping the merit-based scholarship to a GPA requirement of 3.0 and above.





After some initial bumps in the road, the Hostos SGA for 2017-2018 organized itself effectively and came together to work for the benefit of the Hostos Community College Student Body as well as the Bronx community where the college is located.



Beginning with their annual retreat at Edith Macy Conference Center, the group began to negotiate and come to consensus on issues and topics that were relevant to not only their academic careers but to the well-being of student son the campus as a whole. Many members of this year's leadership group made contributions to the community through service and several made contributions to the community by speaking out on issues that they felt were of great importance. In many ways, the collective was able to effect change in small but significant ways throughout the year and has left a good standard that the 2018-2019 group will have to live up to.

Several notable highlights include, Mauricette Gbenenoui being elected as Vice-Chair for Community Colleges by the University Student Senate and her work on behalf of not only community college students, but also students associated with the CUNY Coalition for Student with Disabilities and the Accessibility Resource Center. Mauricette, Thierno Diallo, Sakiyna Switzer, Oumar Diaby and Fatoumata Binta Diallo and others also represented the University at a number of events.

SGA members made contributions to volunteer efforts that included: The 9-11 National Day of Service event at the Intrepid Museum, the 9-11 Community Park Cleanup, the Making Strides Against Breast Cancer Walk at Orchard Beach, New York Cares Day for Schools, the Walk to End Alzheimer's, the Hostos SGA/SLA/PTK Thanksgiving Giveaway, the Hostos Children's Center Toy Giveaway and Holiday Book Reading, Christmas in Chinatown, Aids Walk NYC, the New York Common Pantry food distribution, and a number of other activities. Notable participation at many of these events by Sakiyna Switzer, Thierno Diallo, Raziel BenRuben, Ines Alejandro Soriano, Oumar Diaby and Adama Savadogo. All members of the 2017-2018 SGA participated in numerous volunteer projects, which included their own activities throughout the course of the year.

The 2017-2018 SGA co-sponsored a number of Student Leadership Academy activities and initiatives; including the Hostos Student Leadership Academy Scholarship Orientations, the Hostos Student Leadership Academy Winter Workshop Series, the SGA/SLA/PTK Thanksgiving Giveaway, the SOAR Retreat, breakfast for AIDS Walk NYC and the 11th Annual Passing the Torch Ceremony. (SGA members were also honored at the Passing the Torch Ceremony for their work as SGA members.

Several members of the 2017-2018 Student Government Association were part of the National Model United Nations team that took part in the conference in Washington, D.C. in the fall of 2017.

Two members of the 2018 SGA participated in the New York State Model Senate Session in Albany: Abdoul S. Balde and Fatoumata Binta Diallo. These two also won scholarships and legislative internships for the summer of 2018.

The Hostos SGA sponsored scholarships for students who had financial need and also sponsored merit-based scholarships and under the leadership of Denise Herrera, they awarded 40 scholarships for the 2017-2018 school year.

As a group, the representatives from 2017-2018 took their responsibilities seriously and made a concerted effort to improve the college and the lives of the student body. There were many opportunities for collaboration and the group worked effectively at efforts to raise money for Puerto Rico and devastated communities across the United States as well as taking a stand in support of undocumented members of their own community.
