Office News

We would like to welcome Dr. Sarah Hoiland as the Office of Academic Affairs and Grants Office Faculty Liaison! Dr. Hoiland will provide grant and fellowship writing support to Hostos faculty who are interested in applying for grants and fellowships for the first time and/or for faculty that have received internal grants such as PSC-CUNY but plan to apply for external grants and fellowships through a series of structured workshops in the Fall and Spring semesters. As liaison, Dr. Hoiland will also work to support existing PIs and coPIs. She will team up with the Grants Office to support their initiatives to provide technical support from idea to submission.

Did you know that all faculty and staff involved in research must complete the online CITI training in Responsible Conduct of Research and Conflict of Training.

Note that these certificates **must be on file** with OGRA for any proposals submitted (including the PSC-CUNY research awards).

Updates to Independent Contractors and Memorandums of Understanding (ICAs and MOUs)

There are important updates to ICAs and MOUs due to the NYS Freelance Isn't Free Act (FIFA):

 ICAs and MOUs must specify the rate of pay (hourly, daily, monthly, etc., based on payment or deliverable schedule or based on frequency of invoice submission)

- ICAs and MOUs must include the **method** of payment, and payment **date**
- It will violate FIFA to require an independent contractor to start work on a project without having been given a copy of the required written contract.

Junior Faculty Research Award in Science and Engineering (JFRASE)

The NSF CAREER program is funding 5-7 early career faculty (untenured, as of July 23, 2025) in STEM fields. The funds will be used to develop research projects that have significant scientific, economic and societal impact. - Single items with a value of \$1,000 or more are considered equipment and must be tagged by the Hostos property manager.
- When submitting an order less than \$5,000; this form must be sent to the vendor along with a copy of the quote :<u>RF-201 Small Order Form.</u>
- Orders over \$5,000 require an RF purchase requisition form. Contact the Grants Office for additional guidance.

RF DASHBOARD

CUNY RF has released a new dashboard tool that will allow for users to easily monitor and analyze information relevant to their projects!

It consolidates data from HR, Payroll, and Award Management.

The tool is only available to users with specific access such as Project staff, PIs, Project Directors, Assistant Grants Officers, and Grants Officers

Search for Funding Opportunities

<u>GrantForward</u> and <u>PIVOT</u> allow you to search for opportunities and save them in a personal account or profile. New users must use their Hostos Community College email address to register for a free institutional account. By registering for an account, you can save your grant searches and create alerts for new funding opportunities. Once you create your profile, they will suggest funding sources that match your areas of research.

You can manually enter your research areas into your profile or you can upload a CV or list a webpage containing your publications and it will automatically generate a list of recommended funding opportunities. As an added social media-type feature, you can conduct a profile search to find other researchers registered with GrantForward and PIVOT who share similar research interests.
